PROCLAMATION 2021-04

A PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE BOROUGH OF CONSHOHOCKEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING TEMPORARY PARKING RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE BOROUGH; REPEALING PRIOR INCONSISTENT PROCLAMATIONS OR PARTS OF PROCLAMATIONS; CONTAINING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND SETTING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 10A *Mayor* of the Pennsylvania Borough Code sets forth the powers and duties of the office of Mayor, including the power to act to preserve life, health, property, or the public peace;

WHEREAS, Chapter 15 *Vehicles and traffic* of the Borough's Code of Ordinances, section 15-104 *Temporary and Emergency Regulations* authorizes the Mayor of the Borough of Conshohocken to establish temporary and emergency regulations for parking within the Borough during times of emergency; and

WHEREAS, due to certain emergency circumstances, including continued complications due to the COVID-19 pandemic and road construction occurring in the Borough, the Mayor has identified certain temporary and emergency parking regulations needed to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the Borough's residents and visitors, as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Mayor of the Borough of Conshohocken as follows:

Section 1. Temporary Traffic Regulations.

There is hereby established temporary parking restrictions in the following location as set forth below:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Between</u>	<u>Restriction</u>
Fayette Street	East	East Second Avenue and East Third Avenue	15 Minute "To-Go Orders Only" parking, 3 parking spaces identified by posted signage

Section 2. Ratification by Borough Council.

This regulation shall remain in effect until the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Conshohocken. By this Proclamation, the Mayor hereby requests that Council consider ratifying the temporary parking regulations established herein.

Section 3. Repealer.

Any and all prior inconsistent Proclamations or parts of Proclamations are hereby REPEALED by adoption of this Proclamation.

Section 4. Savings Clause.

If any portion, part or provision of this Proclamation should be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unconstitutional, illegal or unenforceable, the Mayor of the Borough of Conshohocken hereby declares his intent that this Proclamation shall have been made without regard to such unconstitutional, illegal, invalid or unenforceable portion thereof.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This proclamation shall become effective upon its execution by the Mayor of the Borough of Conshohocken.
