CHAPTER 13, SECTIONS 121-130

ALL CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS OF ANY TIER THAT PERFORM WORK ON A CONTRACT VALUED AT OVER \$350,000 ON ANY PUBLIC FACILITY OR PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT, INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION, DEMOLITION, ALTERATION, RENOVATION, REPAIR AND CONTRACT SERVICE OR CONTRACT MAINTENANCE WORK, SHALL MEET THE REQUIREMENT OF THE BOROUGH OF CONSHOHOCKEN RESPONSIBLE CONTRACTORS REQUIREMENTS, CHAPTER 13 SECTIONS 121-130.

IF A FIRM FAILS TO PROVIDE THIS CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY CERTIFICATION, IT SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM BIDDING. NO ACTION OF ANY NATURE SHALL LIE AGAINST THE BOROUGH BECAUSE OF ITS REFUSAL TO ACCEPT A BID FOR FAILING TO PROVIDE THE REQUIRED INFORMATION. IN THE EVENT THAT A SUBCONTRACTOR IS DISQUALIFIED, NO TYPE OF CONTRACTUAL CLAIM SHALL BE PERMITTED AGAINST THE BOROUGH ON THE BASIS ON A SUBCONTRACTOR DISQUALIFICATION.

CONTRACTORS: As a condition of performing work on a public works contract subject to this ordinance, a general contractor, construction manager, or other lead or prime contractor seeking award of a contract shall submit this Contractor Responsibility Certification at the time it submits its bid for a contract.

SUBCONTRACTORS: The Subcontractor Responsibility Certification shall be executed by the respective subcontractors of any tier upon request by the Contractor on this form and shall contain the same information and representations required in the Contractor Responsibility Certifications, including verification of apprenticeship qualifications as required by Chapter 13 Section 123.3.K, for each trade or classification of craft workers it will employ on the project.
